



- Buy plenty of pumpkins to paint, carve, and hammer golf tees into. You could also make pumpkin soup or pumpkin pie.
- Bake Halloween biscuits.
- Use a cauldron with creepy items in. Children to use items to write a potion.
- Use dog biscuits to make a skeleton.
- Make split pin skeletons, spiders or witches.
- Use creepy items such as spiders and eyeballs to count or use for addition and subtraction.
- Discuss stranger danger when trick or treating.
- Have a Halloween party.
- Go on a Halloween hunt finding items for a spell using the initial sounds.
- Count out pumpkin seeds onto pumpkin templates that are numbered.
- Use a paper plate painted black and hole punch around the edges. Then use wool or string and thread it through the holes so it lays over the plate like a spider's web.
- Set up your play dough area with Halloween enhancements such as eye balls, spiders, worms etc..
- Use cardboard tubes and paint them black and add a spider's face on the front. Use a tool to punch holes through the tube and then thread black piper cleaners through the holes to create the spider's legs.
- Learn a dance to the song 'Monster Mash.'
